Joseph has begun working a part-time job in a mechanic shop and is learning a lot of things there. Bethany continues in various types of work and Virginia is helping me with secretarial work. From Virginia and down the kids are still in school and are close to wrapping things up for this term. The weather is turning nice, and we hope to do some gardening this summer. Our house still has not sold and we continue to ask for prayer in that regard. We have been able to continue work on the church building though. It seems the last things take the most time.

Attendance in the church remains good with a sweet spirit among the people. Another family that used to visit sporadically has begun coming faithfully.
